

## Glen C. Reed

Glen C. Reed is manager of security for the Harris County Appraisal District, a position he has held since January 2018.

He brings a total of 22 years of experience to the role in which he is responsible for the day-to-day safety and security of approximately 630 HCAD employees, as well as visitors, of the nation's third largest appraisal district.

Prior to joining HCAD, Reed held progressively responsible positions in security and law enforcement including criminal investigations and threat mitigation. His experience includes 11-years with the University of Texas at Houston system police. Prior to that he was director of security for the AI Price State Juvenile Correctional Facility in Beaumont, TX, and served as a probation officer for the Caddo Parish (Louisiana) juvenile court.

Reed is a member of the Association of Threat Assessment Professionals (ATAP), a non-profit organization comprised of law enforcement, prosecutors, mental health professionals, corporate security experts, and others involved in threat and violence risk assessment.

He graduated from the University of Alaska, Fairbanks, with a degree in sociology. He later earned a master's degree in justice and security administration from the University of Phoenix.

The Harris County Appraisal District is a political subdivision of the State of Texas established in 1980 for the purpose of discovering and appraising property for ad valorem tax purposes for each taxing unit within the boundaries of the district. The district has approximately 1.8 million parcels of property to assess each year with a total market value of approximately \$691 billion. The appraisal district in Harris County is the largest in Texas, serving approximately 500 taxing units, and one of the largest appraisal districts in the United States.
